¹What then shall we say was gained by Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh? ²For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. ³For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness." ⁴Now to the one who works, his wages are not counted as a gift but as his due. ⁵And to the one who does not work but trusts him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness, ⁶just as David also speaks of the blessing of the one to whom God counts righteousness apart from works:

⁷"Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven, and whose sins are covered;

¹³For the promise to Abraham and his offspring that he would be heir of the world did not come through the law but through the

¹⁶That is why it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his offspring—not only to the adherent of the law but also to the one who shares the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all, ¹⁷as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations"—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist.

Countdown to November 4, 2023

175th **Anniversary Project:** Pastor and Becky Jansen worked with Jill Phegley to gather and organize historical information for *The 175*th *Anniversary Project*, a **history/memory book** telling the story of our first 175 years as a congregation. Jill is now working with Diann Scherle to edit, proof, and prepare information for the book before our anniversary on Nov. 4.

Stop by the **mini-museum** room just inside the front entrance to church to check out congregational memorabilia and artifacts.

Each week we are highlighting, in chronological order, a **tidbit from the minutes of one voters' meeting** from one or more years of our congregation's history, 1848-2023. You can find all of the tidbits in Tidbit Archives at www.stjohnlutheranruma.com.

This week's tidbit comes from 1942 and 1943: In the Jan. 1, 1942 meeting, voters decided that, as an act of patriotism, they would drop the German language for the duration of the war. German Lutheran congregations remembered the pressure and prejudice applied to them by both government and citizen groups during WWI. In 1943, the effects of war rations were felt. The Ladies Aid could not get coffee or sugar for their monthly meetings.

Members of the Anniversary Committee are also working on **special activities for each month** throughout the year.
